his may sound offensive to some, but prisons contain many of God's

But I refer to John 3:16 as a reminder: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." Whosoever is a very big word, and it includes everyone!
